What informed our new priorities?

Internal Engagement

- · We sought feedback from our staff and Board of Governors
- Opportunities to contribute through workshops, surveys and team meetings
- Received views on our how we should work in future and the areas we should focus on

What informed our new priorities? **External Engagement**

- Over 25 interviews with our key stakeholders, including disability charities, disabled people's organisations, industry and Government departments
- Gained feedback on our innovation to date and where it could go in future
- Asked what accessible transport problems are most in need of innovation
- An updated innovation framework will help us develop new ideas and decide which opportunities we should pursue

What informed our new priorities?

User Insight

- · Focus groups, surveys and workshops with disabled people
- Established an **Experts by Experience panel** which led our research design
- Involved disabled people on key strategic questions
- Asked disabled people what they most want to see in transport
